PROCUREMENT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CENTERS

- The Procurement Technical Assistance Program (PTAP) was authorized by Congress in 1985 in an effort to expand the number of businesses capable of participating in the Government Marketplace.
- PTACs come in many different sizes and shapes, reflecting the needs, priorities and resources of the areas they serve. Some PTACs are administered directly by state governments, while others partner with universities, community colleges, local economic development corporations or other local institutions. All PTACs are staffed with counselors experienced in government contracting and provide a wide range of services including classes and seminars, individual counseling and easy access to bid opportunities.



PTAC Services

- **94 Procurement Technical Assistance Centers (PTACs) form a nationwide network of procurement professionals.**
- **They offer:**
 - ❖ an understanding of the requirements of government contracting
 - ❖ The know how to obtain and successfully perform federal, state and local government contracts.



State and Federal Certification Programs

- There are several certification programs that assist Small Business including:
 - 8(a) Small Disadvantaged Business (8(a))
 - Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB)
 - Woman Owned Small Business (WOSB)
 - Economically Disadvantaged WOSB (EDWOSB)
 - Historically Underutilized Business Zone (HUB Zone)
 - Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)
 - Women Business Enterprise (WBE)
 - Minority Business Enterprise (MBE)

- ▶ Recycled content items are items produced with recovered materials. The Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) [Comprehensive Procurement Guideline](#) Program (CPG) defines recycled content preference items and lists items manufactured with recycled material that EPA deems equivalent to virgin material for standard applications.
- ▶ Under Section 6002 of the [Resource Conservation and Recovery Act \(RCRA\)](#), EPA is required to designate items that are, or can be, produced with recovered materials and to recommend practices for buying these items. [RCRA Section 6002](#) also requires purchasing agencies to establish Affirmative Procurement Programs (APP) for EPA designated items.



- ▶ **Federal Acquisition Regulation:** The following sections of Part 23 pertain to environmentally preferable products:
- ▶ [FAR 23.703](#) requires agencies to implement cost-effective green contracting preference programs, employ sustainable acquisition strategies, and consider the use of biobased products.
- ▶ [FAR 23.704](#) requires contracts for contractor operation of government facilities to include compliance measures for environmental mandates.
- ▶ [FAR 23.705](#) requires agencies to meet at least 95 percent of their annual acquisition requirement for electronic products categorized by the Electronic Product Environmental Assessment Tool (EPEAT), unless there is no EPEAT standard for such products.

[EPA has designated more than 60 items](#)

Federal Acquisition Regulations requires agencies to purchase recycled content products.

- ▶ [FAR 23.403](#) requires competitive cost-effective purchases of products that meet reasonable performance requirements and are composed of the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable.
- ▶ [FAR 23.404](#) requires agencies to have an APP that provides guidelines for purchasing items with recycled content.
- ▶ [FAR 23.406](#) requires the insertion of contract clauses regarding Recovered Material Certification, Estimate of Percentage of Recovered Material Content for EPA-Designated Products, and EPA-Designated Items in Service and Construction Contracts.
- ▶ [FAR 23.705](#) requires the insertion of the Waste Reduction Program clause ([FAR 52.223-10](#)) in all solicitations and contracts.

State Facilities Energy Conservation Program



MISSOURI BEEDS BUILDING ENERGY EFFICIENCY DESIGN

- ▶ Energy efficiency shall be made a priority in design, construction and operation of state government buildings. The Office of Administration shall develop and adopt a State Building Energy Efficiency
- ▶ Design Standard that establishes and prioritizes energy efficient design techniques specific to the needs and operations of state facilities.
- ▶ The State Building Energy Efficiency Design Standard shall incorporate
- ▶ as goals the energy recommendations and practices presented in the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers' (ASHRAE) Advanced Energy Design Guide for Small Office Buildings.
- ▶ The State Building Energy Efficiency Design Standard shall also be made available for adoption by other state agencies whose building management does not fall under the direction of the Office of Administration.

Wood Chips for Power Plant

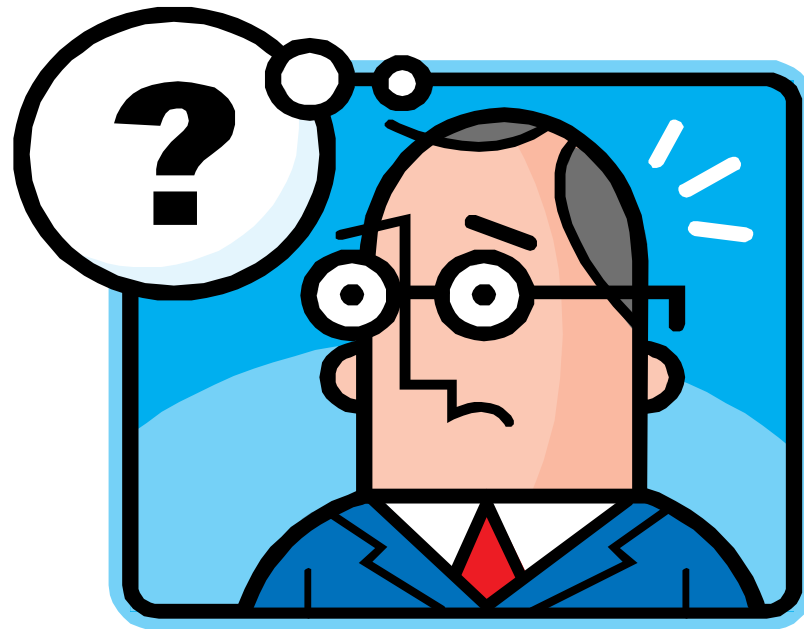
To furnish the City of Columbia's Municipal Power plant with WOOD CHIPS as fuel. In accordance with the specifications.
